President's Report



Assalam Alaikum Wa Rahmat ALLAH wa Barakatu

Dear Brothers and Sisters in South Australia,

Alhamdulillah, with the grace of Allah, 2022 has been such a fruitful year for the Islamic Society of SA (ISSA).

There have been many positive opportunities for ISSA to grow and expand their capacity. Our programs and projects are and have been developed holistically to encompass the community needs at every stage of their lives. A big THANK YOU to our Imams, staff, committee members and not forgetting our volunteers for their contributions and efforts for being the backbone and paving the way for ISSA's continual growth.

I would like to highlight 2021-2022 ISSA's achievements and initiatives that were mentioned in the last Annual General Meeting (AGM).

Youths' Social and Development

With our focus on character building, decision making and civic-mindedness, ISSA continues to partner with key agencies and facilitators to curate workshops and activities for our young people.

Youth Forum 2022 blended the past, present, and future as our young leaders discussed challenges and opportunities that mattered. Ideation and concepts were highlighted and raised. The building blocks of our current youths' programs were developed soon after analysing the data collated through that platform.

Programs such as KBF, CBF & KBS, AAA, Applied Islam for Youth and School holiday programs / activities were catered for all ages, genders, and cultural backgrounds.

These young minds are the epitome of energy, hope and growth, hence ISSA wants to continue our focus to enrich them with practical skills and community service values.

Women's Social and Development

ISSA has continuously connected with local Muslim women to seek suggestions or ideas for services significant to them. ISSA, in consultation with several women's organisations, has organised the following all-women only events and activities:

1. Pearl of Ummah
2. Ladies Bazaar
3. The Sun After The Storm by international speaker sister Yasmin Mogahed
4. Chic Chat
5. Talks and consultation sessions by Amanah Institute

Smithfield Memorial Park

The Islamic Society of South Australia and Adelaide Cemeteries Association have taken a major step towards establishing an Islamic cemetery within Smithfield Memorial Park.

A Memorandum of Agreement has been signed for the multimillion-dollar project in November which will see the development of South Australia's largest Islamic cemetery in the northern suburbs to meet the growing needs of the Islamic community.

In the first phase, ISSA will purchase 1000 burial sites, with potential future expansion to 10,000. ISSA has also been offered the opportunity to lease land within Smithfield Memorial Park to build a prayer room and washing facility.

The project will be funded by ISSA, with burial sites to be developed and maintained by Adelaide Cemeteries as per all its cemeteries, on a commercial basis.

This partnership between ISSA and Adelaide Cemeteries will see the development of South Australia's largest Islamic cemetery in the North. This is another milestone for ISSA in providing support to our Islamic community.

Al Salam Funeral Services

Al Salam Funeral Services (AFS) was established in 2022 to fulfil the role of a Muslim Funeral Director within South Australia, serving the Muslim communities within it. Prior to this, all funeral services in South Australia have been outsourced to other funeral parlours.

Our role will encompass a comprehensive package from arranging care of the deceased to providing guidance and support to families in their time of grief. AFS is an integrated and affordable full funeral service suite that includes lodging formal documentation, washing, shrouding, transfer and burial of the deceased.

This service is available to all Muslims living within South Australia as we aim to provide specialised and extensive support to our community.

Marion Land Project

Alhamdulillah, with all praise to Allah, and with the immense generosity of the community, the purchase of the house at 654 Marion Road was secured in May 2022. This will be a surplus asset for the future of the Muslim community in South Australia.

We have been blown away by the generosity, support, and advocacy towards the society in collecting the funds in such a short time frame. Thank you for making an investment into the future of Islam in the community of South Australia. May Allah bless all involved and fill your lives with endless barakah.

Following the purchase of this property, a community forum was held inviting the community to voice their suggestions and ideas on what we can build on the newly purchased land. Inshallah, we will summarise the proposals and decide the common goal that we will work towards.

Al Salam Humanitarian Foundation (AHF)

Inspired by Islamic principles of empathy and generosity, AHF will provide donors with an avenue to take part in social empowerment. It aims to provide avenues where the financial donors can advance the welfare of charity recipients in Australia and overseas by providing:

- Financial support using Islamic methods of charity to provide immediate short/medium term assistance, for example, rent relief.
- Referral pathways to external agencies for ongoing assistance with, for example, counselling or accommodation.
- Education and advocacy addressing the health, social and environmental factors impeding long term wellbeing.

InshaAllah, once the platform is ready, AHF will jump start its assistance to our local brothers and sisters in need.

Halal Certification

This initiative was mentioned in the last AGM, however due to its complexities, we are planning to partner with an academia or organisation to establish this pathway.

Partnerships

Alhamdulillah, new strategic partnerships forged with the following organisations to provide value-added services for our community.

1. Sonder – CV drop-in session was held
2. ARA – homework club in Al Salam Community Centre
3. Morella Community Centre – Twilight Family Fun

Application for a change in Anti-Racism Framework

Sadly, several communities are continually targeted both online and offline and are subjected to widespread discrimination in relation to their religion, race or ethnicity. Unfortunately, they do not benefit from civil legal protection as afforded to Jews, Sikhs and other groups covered by race-based protections. Therefore, in light of this, ISSA has submitted a letter to the Attorney General and Minister for Multicultural Affairs to propose for the following change to ensure all religions are afforded the same:

1. Add religious belief or activity as a protected characteristic to existing protections from Discrimination, Vilification and Victimisation
2. Introduce a Statutory Penalty Enhancement for crimes either wholly or partially motivated by hatred towards a group based on protected characteristics

Annual Events

Throughout the year we successfully upheld our annual events, namely, Pearl of the Ummah, Ladies Bazaar, Kids Fest 2021, Ramadan Carnival and the Mosque Open Day (both regional & metro). These events are enablers for the wider community to connect and engage, an opportunity to break down barriers and reduce social isolation.

Final

On a finishing note, I would like to extend my deepest gratitude and sincere appreciation to the SA Muslim community at large. This extends to all volunteers, men, women, youth, Imams, staff, committee members and local and state government who have assisted in supporting the Islamic Society of SA. Many sacrificed both manpower and money to help boost the Society. Your belief in ISSA has helped us do great work this year and your continued involvement and support only strengthen the bonds of our community, Alhamdulillah. Please keep supporting ISSA in order "TO EMPOWER THE MUSLIM COMMUNITY IN SA"

Dear Brothers and Sisters in South Australia

As we are approaching the end of this term, we would like to thank our SA Muslim community for their continuing trust and support of ISSA committee members. It has been a pleasure to serve our Muslim community for the challenging past 4-year term. The Muslim community demonstrated strong commitments to our Islamic values and dedication to support ISSA's projects and initiatives to build a strong and active Muslim community. It has been a great privilege to serve our Deen, Muslim community, and the wider community in South Australia.

I would like also to extend my thanks to all committee members, staff, Imams and volunteers for the hard work and time dedicated to ISSA meetings, commitments, and activities over the past four years.

In the past four years, ISSA members attended large number of regular and special meetings to discuss all operational activities of the society in addition to finances and future. Some of the main items discussed include Masjids' extensions and maintenance, Masjids and centres' activities (including Quran and Islamic activities, Saturday schools, youth, reverts, etc), expenses and grants' applications and follow up, and staff management including Imams, centres managers and officers, new projects, strategic plans, community related issues and ISSA management activities with local and federal Governments, new Islamic cemetery project, many, many more new projects and initiatives.

The next election will be open for every financial member who has been a financial member for 2 consecutive years (including the current committee members). Any person who has donated to the society automatically qualify to be a financial member, however they still need to complete the appropriate documents.

We are looking forward to seeing more involvement of our community members both as financial members and supporters of ISSA and as executive members of ISSA management committee. We encourage and welcome new blood especially from our youth and sisters to join us in building new future for the Muslim community in the 21st century.

In the coming AGM, we will discuss our end of term reports including Auditors' report, elect our new committee members, and discuss suggested modifications to the constitution in addition to any other special business of which notice is given in accordance with the constitution.

Recommended Constitution modifications:

Election term to be for 3 years

1. Nominees should submit their CV or Resume to the community before election
2. Encourage skilled and proficient people to be on the board (We recommend having at least one with legal qualifications, one with accounting and /or finance qualifications)
3. Encourage women to be on the board
4. Encourage youth to be on the board
5. Three new members who can attend ISSA meetings and participate in discussions and communicate their community needs (with no voting powers at this stage) shall be added
 - a. Murray Bridge
 - b. Whyalla
 - c. Mount Gambier

These members to be nominated or elected by the community in their areas (conditional that all of them are to be financial members of ISSA).

In case, no nomination from these areas, ISSA committee will appoint a person.

Thank you again for your support and looking forward to a fruitful and exciting AGM.

It is a well-established fact for many that the Imam's responsibility is to lead daily prayers, deliver Friday and Eid sermons etc. In fact, the Imam's role is not restricted to that rather it goes far more beyond that. At the Masjid Abi Bakr As Siddique, we follow the Islamic doctrines and beliefs according to the Sunni's school of thoughts. I provide funeral, matrimonial, and divorce counselling services. I also conduct youth focused activities, as well as working with the Islamic Society to prevent discrimination on any basis including (but not limited to) school of thought. In addition to the above, I serve as an Islamic & Quranic teacher at the Garden College. I am also affiliated with the Australian National Council of Imams (ANIC) and a member of the executive committee and also a founding member of the Council of Imams of SA. Furthermore, I am a registered marriage celebrant and serve the Muslim community in that capacity as well. I take huge pride in serving the oppressed Muslims, to be their voice and am pro-active to raise awareness whether it be the Muslims of Palestine, Kashmir, Rohingya and East Turkistan.

As part of the continuous effort to advance the cause of Islam is to also organise programs in the masjid such as:

- 1- Quranic class for boys and girls on Mondays & Thursdays evenings.
- 2- Weekly Islamic lesson from the book of "Bulooghul Maraam" every Sunday between Maghrib & Isha
- 3- Khatm Al Quran (aiming to recite the whole Quran) in the daily Prayers (Fajr, Maghrib, Isha) and giving brief explanation of the verses recited after Isha every night.
